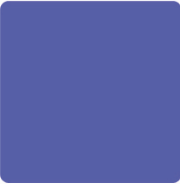
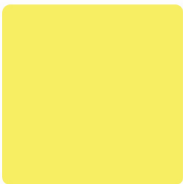

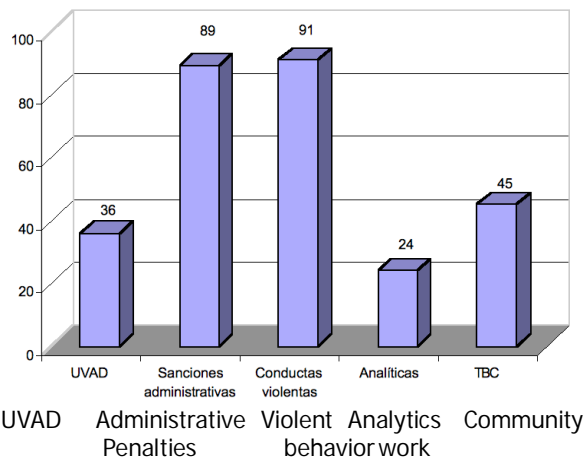

## 285 Cases treated

Serves as an effective technical support to the legal establishment on those subjects related to psychoactive substance abuse and other behaviors, as well as dysfunction in people's behavior, advising and evaluating those cases where the existence of a problem results conflicts of legal nature. It also develops specific programs within penitentiary centers.

The main activities of the Legal Advisory Service and Intervention (SAJI) are focused on:

- Assessment unit and support in drug addiction (UVAD).
- Advisory and legal expertise
- Control and monitoring of alternative security measures.
- Administrative penalties
- Traces of court measures (community work)
- Analytical control of prisoners in third grade
- Intervention in behavior
- Violence (in penitentiary center and open environment)
- Genders workshop



### Profiles UVAD

Male, between 42 and 49 years old, of Spanish nationality, single, unemployed, with completed primary studies. Consumer of snorted cocaine , began consuming between 11 and 18 years.

### In penitentiary environment (Intervention and awareness)

Male, divorced and with children, over 40 years old, Spanish nationality, Primary school graduated. Consumer of snorted cocaine and began to consume between 14 and 20 years old

### In open environment (Reeducation population with court measures)

Man over 26 years, Spanish, separated or divorced, with graduated school, unemployed. 18% of the cases present problems of addiction (heroin, cocaine and alcohol) from 15-18 years, with its main administration via intranasal (snorting)

## ASSISTANCE

# 337 cases treated

The various resources in this area aim to achieve the detoxification of the people with addiction problems toxic and nontoxic. Its mission is to provide, on an outpatient basis and / or commitment-residential, detoxification treatment, rehabilitation and reintegration, using pharmacotherapy, psychological, occupational and social, promoting active participation of patients to promote their social normalization. The ultimate goal is to facilitate the social integration of these people and others considered at risk of social exclusion through professional and specialized care.
